


BLACKHAWK RECREATION CENTER Annex Specialty Rooms Project





WHY A RECREATION CENTER?

Easy. We want to provide opportunities for growth and development for the students we serve.

Students who engage with others outside the classroom are much more likely to achieve their goals, get better grades, and graduate on time.

In a survey of SCC students in 2021, 2/3 respondents reported that the presence of a student center would somewhat or strongly influence their decision to attend SCC.

WHY NOW?

In SCC's 2014 feasibility study, a student center was cited as the third-highest priority after expanding career & technical program

facilities (#1) and expanding health program facilities (#2), both of which have been completed.


In the fall of 2023, SCC welcomed a record 209 resident students to the West Burlington campus. Providing a quality campus experience outside of the classroom will be critical if we wish to remain competitive with other institutions. And with the lion's share of our students coming from our local communities, it is important that we provide a quality campus experience for them as well.

HOW ARE THINGS GOING?

In keeping with Dr. Ash's mantra, "It's about the students," nearly every project SCC has undertaken in the past ten years has been to increase student success. With a focus on modernization of facilities and equipment and expansion of student support services, our efforts are paying off.


Student enrollment has trended up over the last 5 semesters. Most notably, our fall 2023 semester showed a 9% total increase with every sector of the college seeing growth – second-highest in Iowa.

More students are also persisting through college as they work toward their educational goals. Our retention rate has increased by over 10% since 2019. And they're earning more credentials like degrees and diplomas as a result.

DOESN'T THE COLLEGE HAVE THE MONEY?

SCC has a long history of being reliable stewards of college funds. We have been creative in developing non-traditional revenue streams to fund projects beyond overly relying on charitable giving and increasing student tuition. We have successfully applied for federal, state, and private grants, and entered into novel public-private partnerships. This approach has allowed us to invest \$40 million in facilities and infrastructure improvements since 2012.

We were able to fully-fund the current Blackhawk Recreation Center and outdoor training facility projects without need for a capital campaign. The same is true for our current campus facilities project. The cost of these three fully-funded projects is nearly \$8 million.

Even with that creative approach, we just couldn't stretch our dollars enough to complete the annex specialty rooms project.

WHY ADD THE SPECIAL ROOMS SEPARATELY?

We explored including more amenities in the new facility but the numbers didn't work. Thanks to the addition of other facilities in recent years, we have been able to repurpose old spaces to meet new needs. Renovating the ground floor classrooms of the Building 300 (opened in the late '90s) means we can offer new amenities more affordably. The recreation center will allow for large-scale activities and programming for students. The specialty rooms will allow us to deliver complementary programming.

WHAT IS THE TIMELINE?

The Blackhawk Recreation Center is set to open before fall semester, 2023. We hope to have this project completed at the same time. Given the relative light lift of the refurb work required (versus all-new construction), we believe this is an attainable goal.

"As a 57-year-old non-traditional student, I sometimes feel left out of the younger groups. I believe that by bringing people together we could enjoy one another's company."

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
