

Campus Hazing Transparency Report

Background Information

On December 23, 2024, the Stop Campus Hazing Act was signed into law. In order to ensure that Southeastern Community College was fully versed on all aspects of this new legislation, and received necessary legal guidance, appropriate College personnel attended an online workshop facilitated by attorneys from the law firm of Ahlers & Cooney. A subsequent workshop facilitated by Vector Solutions provided insights on training advisors and students. The College passed [Administrative Guideline 1017](#), which addresses Hazing, on April 29, 2025.

Awareness Efforts

A brochure was developed that addresses Administrative Guideline 1017. In order to ensure that anyone who might serve as the advisor to a club/organization, head or assistant athletic team coach, and the residence life coordinator, has been trained, the dean of students then met with each of the following groups of individuals to make them aware of the College's responsibilities to educate students within their respective groups about hazing, and to stop hazing from occurring:

- All faculty,
- All head and assistant coaches, and
- All club and organization advisors.

All students are asked to familiarize themselves with the dangers of hazing, and legislation outlawing hazing, by completing the following Safe Colleges (Vector Solutions) courses:

- Hazing Awareness and Prevention for Students
- Hazing Awareness and Prevention for Students Follow-up Survey

Additionally, students can read Administrative Guideline 1017 on the SCC website. Each student received a safety email message that addressed hazing, among other topics. Finally, flyers are posted around campus, and advertisements published in the campus newsletters, that direct students to learn more by reading Administrative Guideline 1017.

SCC Hazing Policy Violation Report

Each institution of higher education is required to publish or distribute a list of registered student organizations that have been disciplined or convicted for hazing violations on or off-campus during the previous three years. The report shall follow the format below. Additionally hazing incidents must be included on the annual security report.

The Stop Campus Hazing Act was passed on December 23, 2024. From the date of passage through December 15, 2025, there have been no alleged acts of hazing reported at Southeastern Community College.
