Class A CDL Course overview (160 Hours):

Class A CDL is the heaviest weight class, with a gross combination weight rating (GVWR) of 26,001 or more pounds, provided the towed vehicle is heavier than 10,001 pounds. Vehicles requiring a Class A CDL license are primarily tractor trailers (also known as Semi, Big Rig or 18-wheeler) driving long distances. Examples include truck and trailer combinations, tanker vehicles, livestock carriers, and flatbeds.

Class B CDL Course overview (120 Hours):

Class B CDL is the second heaviest weight class, with a (GVWR) of 26,001 pounds or more and trailers weighing less than 10,000 pounds that are not hitched to a trailer.

Examples include straight trucks, large buses, cement mixers, box trucks, dump trucks, and food service trucks

Admission Requirements

- Must have a valid driver's license and social security card
- CDL Permit
- Physically capable of performing tasks related to driving a truck
- Must be 21 years of age or older (18 years old for in-state driving)
- Must have no outstanding warrants for arrest
- No felony convictions during the last five years
- No conviction for driving under the influence, driving while intoxicated or similar convictions in the last five years
- Should have no more than three moving violations in the last three years
- Must be able to pass the DOT physical and drug screen
