FROM BUCKET LIST TO PAYCHECK

SCC's CDL program helps students shift gears in life

After 33 years working in the same factory, Pat Neely found himself at a crossroads.

"I kept hearing the same thing: 'Do you have your CDL?" Pat recalled. "When I didn't get a job I applied for, I figured it was time to make a change."

Like many adult learners, Pat wanted something steady. For him, that meant finally checking off a longtime goal: earning his commercial driver's license.

TRAINING THAT GETS RESULTS

Pat signed up for SCC's CDL program after hearing about its hands-on training and experienced instructors. He got more than just a license.

"I'd never been around semis before. I was raised on a farm, but we always used wagons, never the big rigs," Pat said. "The training was excellent. Bill, the instructor, had years of experience and told us stories that stuck with me. They still help me on the road."

SCC's program includes training on automatic and manual transmissions, full-size trailers, and real driving on local roads. Students begin with a required safety and rules class before moving into parking lots and behind-the-wheel sessions. A driving simulator gives students a safe, low-pressure way to practice shifting and handling before they hit the road.

"The instructors walked us through everything," Pat said. "They even had the truck ready at the license station. If someone didn't pass, they helped them work through it. They made sure all your time in class wasn't wasted."

Pat earned his Class A license along with hazmat, tanker, manual transmission, and double-triple trailer endorsements.

"That opened up more doors. I had several job offers before I even finished,"

he said. "The hazmat especially made a difference."

INSTRUCTORS WHO KNOW THE **ROAD**

SCC instructor Bill Claus brings more than 25 years of professional driving experience to the classroom. His lessons combine real-world examples with one-on-one support.

"I tell students I'll be their GPS, but they have to make the decisions," Bill said. "It's about reading signs, scanning your surroundings, and thinking ahead. That's how you stay safe."

He often works privately with students who feel nervous about driving.

"If someone has stage fright or needs more time, we give them that," he said. "Then we bring them back into the group when they're ready."

He says the biggest change happens in just a few weeks.

"By the end of the program, they're backing up, parking, and handling the truck without hesitation," he said. "They can put it where you want it. That's a rewarding thing to see."

Bill is part of an experienced teaching team that includes Clay Novinger and Richard Link. Clay works for the Department of Transportation and trains students on nights and weekends. Richard is the former transportation director for Burlington Schools, where he led student transportation services for more than 20 years.

SCC has been able to offer these program enhancements thanks to a \$1.9 million federal grant from the U.S. Department of Labor aimed at strengthening community colleges. The funding supports SCC's work to serve more adult learners and underserved populations throughout the region

through additional resources like digital simulation, integrated education and training, and career coaching.

PUTTING IT TO WORK

After graduating, Pat returned to his family's farming operation with new skills and more freedom.

"Now I can haul my own crops," he said. "My combine driver doesn't have to stop and wait. It saves time and money, and I don't have to hire anyone else."

He's also helped out other farmers, trading driving help for labor.

"If you're thinking about it, do it," Pat said. "SCC gives you everything from the classroom to the road test. It was well worth the time and money."

ALCOHOL & OTHER DRUG SAFETY

Alcohol and Other Drug Awareness for Managers and Supervisors (Initial)

lowa's drug testing law (lowa Code Section 730.5, paragraph 9.h. and Administrative Code Section 640) enhances worker safety by creating workplaces that are free of drug and substance abuse. One tool available to private sector employers is drug testing (inclusive of alcohol testing). A private-sector employer who chooses to use this tool must attend a minimum of two hours of initial training to begin, and a minimum of one hour annually for update or refresher training. This training meets the initial two hour training requirement and includes information concerning the recognition of evidence of employee alcohol and/ or other drug abuse, the documentation and corroboration of alcohol and/or other drug abuse, and the referral of employees who abuse alcohol and/or other drugs to the employee assistance program or to the resource file maintained by the employer pursuant to paragraph "C", subparagraph (2) of the Iowa Code. This course also satisfies the requirements for supervisor training.
