HOLVOET FORGES A NEW FUTURE WITH PRECISION MACHINING PROGRAM

Three years ago, Connor Holvoet began to rethink his future. He had earned an agribusiness degree from DMACC and came back to work on the family farm. But the long hours and harsh weather slowly revealed a truth he couldn't ignore. He wanted a career that felt creative, something that would let him build a future that was truly his own.

"I have always liked building things," said Holvoet. "When my buddy told me about SCC's machining program, it caught my attention. Then I talked to my great uncle, who spent years as a mold maker, and it finally felt like I had found the right direction."

Holvoet enrolled in SCC's Precision Machining and CNC **Technology** program on the West Burlington campus, diving straight into machining coursework. With his general education classes already finished, he balanced school with a part-time job.

He appreciated the small class sizes and easy access to a learning lab full of equipment.

"The hands-on work was huge," he continued. "Having one-on-one time with the instructors and access to all the equipment made a big difference."

After his first year in the program, he began working at Steffensmeier Welding and Manufacturing in Pilot Grove. He quickly found his footing. Thanks to his classroom learning and practical training, he could instantly apply his newfound skills.

"SCC taught me the language of the trade," he said. "I might not have done every exact task before, but when I went back for my second year, everything clicked."

Today, Holvoet builds precision parts as a machinist, programming CNC machines, running manual lathes, and refining production processes on the shop floor at Steffensmeier.

"I love seeing a drawing on paper and knowing I can make it out of a solid block of metal," he said. "When you are holding something that perfect, with tolerances smaller than a hair, that is a pretty satisfying moment."

For students considering the field, his advice is simple. "If you have an open mind, a willingness to learn and adapt, machining will open a lot of doors for you," Holvoet explained.

Holvoet believes the demand for skilled machinists will only continue to increase, giving him a solid foundation for the years ahead. "There are so many opportunities in this field. I see myself doing this for a long time."
