Drug and Alcohol Abuse Education Programs:

The College encourages and provides reasonable assistance to any student, faculty, or staff member who seeks information on chemical dependence or treatment for chemical dependency. New employees are informed at staff orientation regarding SCC's compliance with both the Drug Free Schools and Communities Act Amendments of 1989, and the Drug Free Workplace Act of 1988. Students are provided similar information with regard to SCC's compliance with these regulations.

New staff are also provided information regarding community agencies/resources for individual and family assistance related to substance abuse issues. The College's EAP (Employee Assistance Program), which is available at no-cost for a wide variety of needs and concerns including alcohol and drug addictions, is described in a brochure available to all employees.

During new student orientation, students are directed to consumer information for information on the College's policies on drugs, alcohol, and tobacco, and a contact list for community agencies specializing in substance abuse treatment is provided.

Throughout the academic year, various drug and alcohol awareness/prevention programs and resources are sponsored by the Student Board, Student Activities and Residence Life. Students and staff may be referred to the following resources for additional information:
